Can you tell us about yourself?

I am living an active lifestyle. I enjoy outdoor activities and often go to outdoor music festivals to listen to my favorite band playing. I used to major in marine environment engineering when I was at university and I am very keen to develop my career related to the offshore industry.



What motivates you to become an offshore wind technician?

The reason that I chose offshore wind technician as my career and started to walk down the path is because I found out that this job offers all the things I want: global work opportunities, unusual working experiences, get to go offshore on BIG vessels, get to work physically and it is a booming industry in Taiwan which means it has many possibilities waiting for me to discover.

What is your first offshore work like?

My first offshore work experience after training was going to Fuhai Met Mast with the team. I remember we were doing maintenance of UPS (Uninterruptible Power Supply) system on the Met Mast; the battery of UPS system was depleted and we needed to replace a total of 60 batteries, and each of them weighed 30kg, we spent almost a full day lifting the batteries up and down. After we completed the maintenance work, the feeling of sea breeze on my cheek during the return trip made me feel really good.

My most fulfilling experience so far would be the one when I was working in the GCH (Greater Changhua) pre-assembly site. I enjoyed working with experienced technicians from all over the world and I learned a lot from them.
